Dear Dormitory Parents,

With several weeks left until school, we are anxiously anticipating your son's arrival at the Mesivta of T.A. and looking very much forward to his enhancing our Yeshiva program by being a member of our dormitory.

We are also enclosing a recommended clothing and personal item list along with various permission and medical information forms. Please return the completed forms to the high school office before the first day of school. **A student arriving without all the appropriate forms in our possession will not be allowed to attend.** There has been more than one instance where the local hospital emergency room has delayed treatment due to forms insufficiently filled out. Please provide a **new** copy of both sides of your insurance card along with address and phone number **of the company to facilitate medical care.** For foreign students, please make sure that your insurance covers treatment in the United States and provide documentation of coverage.

For new students: If you have not already done so, please provide an up-to-date record of your son's immunization record. No student is allowed in school without this information. **Also, please have your son's school records forwarded to us so we may know where he is to be placed.** No student is allowed in school without this information.

The school year begins on Monday evening, September 5th at 7:15 PM. Students should arrive on September 5th between 2:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M. Supper will be served at 6:00 P.M. The Z'man begins at 7:15 P.M. with Mincha in the Mesivta Bais Medrash.

We hope your son will arrive refreshed and ready for a very exciting and successful stay at the Mesivta of T.A. Have a safe trip, and may we greet you in good health and spirits on Monday, September 5th.
