Parshas Beshalach

Klal Yisroel were surrounded on all sides with no room for escape. As the scene played out by the Yam Suf, we find that they engaged in Tefilah, just as the Avos would have done. Moshe took the lead in his davening that Paroh and his army should be destroyed without Klal Yisroel having to take initiative and act. However, we find that Hashem gave Moshe Rabeinu the directive to travel forward into the Yam. Now was the time for action, davening would not suffice. HKB"H was sending the message that first you must demonstrate your trust that I will save you by taking the "leap of faith" and going forward into the Yam Suf.

The *Parshah* is clarifying for us the necessity of *Hishtadlus*, the way that Hashem wishes for us to proceed. When faced with adversity, certainly there is the need for *Tefilah*, however *HKB*"*H* is expecting

us to take action while fully understanding that ultimately the combination of *Emunah* with *Tefilah* and our actions will lead us to come out victorious. With these three components we are *zoche* to Siyata *Dishmaya* to be successful.

In our lives we are faced with numerous challenges that take up much of our time. As adults, we use this "roadmap" to navigate difficulties and overcome them. Our children watch us and observe how we behave under such circumstances. They carefully observe how we turn to our *Rabbonim* and other spiritual mentors for guidance. These opportunities to be *mechaneich* our children form their view and perspective on facing life's challenges. May we have much *Siyata* in setting a shining example for them.


